
- Biometric attendance for every employee

- Daily lecture update on e-governance for students.


#### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

- Low Computer Literacy: More than 90% of Indians lack basic computer skills. One of the main problems is that between 25% and 30% of the population is illiterate.
- Resistance to Change: Although there have been many changes brought about by the advent of information technology, there are still a number of officials, citizens, and politicians who are reluctant to change and who have differing views on e-Government.




